
organize the lounge for social distancing. August 23rd is our opening date for Bible Class. Sign up and reserve your spot today!





Spotlight on Service

From the old African proverb that says, "It takes a village to raise a child", we realize that a child is influenced by everyone they encounter. Similarly, it may take a whole congregation to share God's love- especially when it comes to a smooth-running Sunday morning service! While everyone can readily acknowledge the contribution of the pastor, music director, praise band, and choir;

there are many other members working before, during, and after the service. Today, I would like to highlight some of these positions.

Many volunteers are involved with pre-service preparation. The bulletin and its inserts must be typed, run off, and folded. If you prefer using the screens rather than the bulletin and hymnals, you can be thankful to the person who types the service for the screens. Someone makes sure the cards, envelopes, and pencils are ready for use in the pews (pre-pandemic). Children's activity packets are checked and refurbished. Members of the altar guild make sure the altar area is clean and ready for each service. Flowers are ordered and placed on the altar area. If a service includes the Lord's Supper, an elder will need to get the communion ware ready and placed on the altar. Banners are made for children's baptisms. Elders and trustees make sure the church is open, lights are on, and heat/air are working.

During the service, you probably have noticed many helpful parishioners. The ushers, who passed out bulletins before the service, are now taking the offering and guiding us to the Lord's Supper. Elders help with the distribution of communion. There are techs who run the screen, tend to the sound system, and live stream the service. Candles are lit and extinguished by acolytes. Members take turns reading the Old Testament and Epistle lessons. The children are invited to come up and hear a message prepared for them by a church member.

Even after the Sunday morning services, many individuals are serving the Lord. The communion ware is cleaned and stored. The offering is counted and recorded. Attendance is recorded. During this pandemic, the sanctuary is sanitized between services. If there was a baptism, a card is sent out to the parents. Lights are turned out and doors are locked.

We are told In 1st Peter Chapter 4 that we all have received gifts to serve one another in order that in everything God may be glorified. All the stewards mentioned above are doing just that. Let us ever be thankful for all those who serve us by helping make our worship services possible. If anyone is interested in serving in any of these capacities, please notify the church office.
