A LOUD SILENCE

Angels have always fascinated me. Ever since I can remember, I've always been so captivated by their involvement, purpose, appearance, etc. Why? I'm not entirely sure, to be honest. It could be their enchanting mysteries of power and intelligence. It could be their mesmerizing number of hosts and armies. It could just be my intrigue in how old they really are even to this day. But what I love most about the angels is their marvelous commitment to singing the glories of the Lord every chance they get. Literally! They praise God *all the time!* Shouts for joy! Hosannahs in the highest! This is popularly indicated in the birth of Jesus- Luke 2:13-14, *"And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"* Our St. Paul Lutheran Church choir is pretty great... but this choir is like any other! Joyful shouts. Resounding cries. Rejoicing joy. Worship galore! This I know for sure- I can't wait to join the angels, archangels, and the company of heaven in their singing.

For these next few weeks, it will seem like we'll be sinking further into the deep void of hosannahs, shouts for joy, and resounding cries. Our ears will hear another kind of sound... one that will twist and turn our hearts into sorrow and despair. A loud silence from heaven. We will be forced to suppress our alleluia's. Muffle our hurray's. Extinguish our joys. Well... for now. Because on that third day, that desolate silence will die and our triumphant jubilees will live! Our voices will be raised exultantly as we sing once again with ecstatic hearts! And the choir of heaven will start a new song- a song that will last forever and ever. Don't let that loud silence from heaven scare you. They're just preparing themselves for the melody of Easter. Glory to God in the highest.

In *The Marks of Love*, we meet a Savior who endured life's hardships, suffered our pain, and bore the weight of our sins. Each left its mark on Him as He pressed on to the cross, giving His life for ours, appeasing God's wrath against sin, and rising victorious over sin, death, and the devil.

Spotlight

During the month of February, *The 1 % Solution* was introduced to the congregation. It is an idea developed by the LCMS and was shared as part of its Stewardship Ministry. *The 1 % Solution* suggests we spend 1% of our daily minutes, around 14 minutes, in prayer or reading the Bible. It also suggests we spend 1% of our waking hours weekly together in worship which is a little over one hour. Neither seems like a significant imposition. 14 minutes is not hard to find to spend time either praying or studying the Bible. Making one hour per week available to worship should be doable, right?

The 1 % Solution, this simple idea, is encouraging all of us to be more intentional, to make time to work on our spiritual health and our relationship with our Creator, our Lord, Our Savior, Our God every day.

The intent of this idea is not to take out a stopwatch and once we reach 1% of our daily minutes reading the Bible, we close it up and set it aside until tomorrow. We shouldn't simply say 'A-men' and stop praying after 14 minutes have passed if we have more to share with God. That's crazy. It doesn't suggest that if we attend a worship service that runs a little long, we walk out during communion or the benediction. It isn't telling us to compartmentalize or limit our faith.

On the contrary, it suggests we dedicate time to our spiritual growth through prayer and Bible study. It reminds that our spiritual health is more important than our physical, mental or financial health. Our relationship with God should be a priority, even more so than our relationships with our family and friends.

C.S. Lewis shared, "God can't give peace and happiness apart from Himself because there is no such thing." Knowing this, knowing God is always ready to listen and speak to us, shouldn't we desire to make time to talk to Him, to be closer to Him and never be apart?

Martin Luther stated that, "To be a Christian without prayer is not more possible than to be alive without breathing." We breath every minute, every day of our lives. It's essential. Prayer is essential to our faith as it nurtures and sustains it. We need to be diligent and make time for prayer daily and often.

Being faithful and leaning on God will help us deal with earthly stress and concerns. With God's help, we'll love, forgive and encourage each other in ways we may not if we are distant from God. We'll manage our time, our health, our finances, our relationships, everything we do every day faithfully, the closer we are to God and the better we understand His expectations for us.

Let's spend a minute (about .07% of our daily minutes) reading and thinking about a Bible verse regarding worship: **Hebrews 10:24-25 ESV**

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

God is speaking to all of us through this scripture. In worship together, we hear each other's voices in praise, we pray together in one voice, we confess our sins and are forgiven together, we hear God's Word and we commune together. We encourage one another and we do good things together because of God's love for us and our love for Him. *The 1 % Solution* is emphasizing how important worshipping together is for reinforcing and strengthening our faith.

Martin Luther shared that, "To gather God's people in united adoration of the Father is as necessary to the Christian life as prayer." He recognized how intertwined these gifts from God are: Prayer, Studying the Word and Worshipping together. Each provides direct access to God! Each can help the Holy Spirit bolster our faith.

Our prayer in sharing *The 1 % Solution*, this very simple idea, this subtle reminder, is that all who read it and reflect are moved by the Holy Spirit to faithfully engage in prayer, Bible Study and worship **often** so that all are equipped to navigate this world with awesome, Christ-centered confidence. Ultimately, the Holy Spirit can work through our faithfulness to bring others to Christ.
