Punctuate Your Prayer

Fear. Worry. Panic. Distress. All the feelings we don't want to feel. In fact, this never was part of the plan in the first place. You know- the original plan. God's plan. What he *wanted* you to feel for all of eternity. Everything was supposed to be "good" (Genesis 1). God looked upon the light and called it good. He looked upon the waters and called it good. God looked upon the earth, the vegetation, the plants, fruits, trees, living creatures, even mankind itself and called it good! But fear? Worry? Panic? Distress? This was not good. This was not his plan. The taint of sin and its poisons were not at all part of the plan. I can't help but think of the world we live in right now and the groaning of all of creation. Covid19 was not part of the plan. Separating families and friends because of CV19 was not part of the plan. Death was not part of the plan. And it's painful to see. It's painful to hear. It's just... painful. Unplanned pain.

Jesus was no stranger to this pain. Slow down! Don't go to the cross too quickly just yet! There is so much more for us to see. Think about how many times Jesus looked upon his craftsmanship, his world, his people, and thought: this is not at all how I planned it. This is not at all how I wanted it. Can you imagine how painful it was for Jesus to see sickness reign, death stalk, hate lingering, and fear prevailing? Can you imagine how painful it was for those men and women whom he created with his own fingers to condemn him to the cross? Can you imagine the fear, worry, panic, and distress that Jesus felt? Imagine the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus was absolutely terrified! So much so that Luke describes Jesus to sweat blood (Luke 22:44). This is actually a real medical condition called "hematidrosis" in which severe anxiety causes the release of chemicals that break down the capillaries in the sweat glands. When this occurs, sweat comes out tinged with blood. How remarkable it was that Jesus, the Son of Man and the Son of God, felt such human feelings. But he told us this for a reason- so that you may know that there is nothing in this world that he wouldn't understand. There is no feeling, no fear, no worry, no distress that our Lord could not grasp. But more importantly, Jesus was also showing you how to respond to such feelings: pray. If Jesus, who was about to undergo the world's harshest punishment and carry the sin of the world on his shoulder, thought prayer was the best and only way to combat such dreadful feelings, then why shouldn't we when it comes to ours?

Whenever you're about to enter into life's Gethsemane, and combat those feelings of fear, worry, panic, and distress, don't go in alone. Call upon the Lord and he will answer (Jer. 33:3). And while you're there, be honest. Express your feelings just as Jesus did. Tears are permitted. Praying is commanded (Philippians 4:6-...in everything with prayer and supplication...). Open up your heart to Jesus and punctuate your prayers. He has plenty of time and even more compassion. For he is "good" no matter how much bad surrounds us. Yes, there is so much happening that was unplanned. But the plans he has for you are ... well, good.

People across the nation have been gathering on this day since 1952 when President Harry S. Truman signed into law a joint resolution of the U.S. Congress. We will gather on May 6 at 12:00 Noon in the church sanctuary along with St. Paul teachers and students. The theme for this year's observance is Lord Pour Out Your LOVE, LIFE, AND LIBERTY based on 2 Corinthians 3:17. "Now the Lord is the Spirit and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." We will pray through 7 centers of influence in our nation as outlined by the National Day of Prayer Task Force - Family, Church, Workplace, Education, Military, Government and Art, Media & Entertainment. REGISTRATION FOR NEXT YEAR

We are now accepting registration for the next school year (2021-2022). In order to re-enroll, please fill out a Re-enrollment Form and a Smart Tuition Form and return it with your check to the school office. **Please note**: Registration cannot be accepted if your tuition is not current. If you have any questions, please contact the school office at 248.546.6555. Please register early. We are having inquiries everyday, and we would not want you to loose your place in class.

Please notice the following schedule:

Registration Fees (K - 8th Grade) will be:

\$300 - if paid by April 30

\$350 - if paid by May 31

\$400 - if paid by June 1 or after

Our Preschool Registration Fee is \$130. Registration Fees are not refundable.

FINANCIAL AID FOR 2021-2022 St. Paul provides grants for tuition assistance for member families that qualify for financial aid. We have enlisted the services of Smart Aid, a company that provides a financial aid analysis service, for the purpose of evaluating an applicant's need for aid. If you feel you may qualify for aid, you must complete an online application at: smartaidforparents.com The application fee is \$35, and our School ID is 13489. Your application will only be considered if your tuition is current. Completed Applications and Supporting Documents are due by April 30, 2021. NO EXCEPTIONS!
