## Unshakable Assurance

The Book of Concord. Ever heard of it? Not many people have. And even for those who have heard of it, they’ve never really read it. Do I blame them? I can’t. I was one of those people not too long ago. If you blow the dust off the cover, crack open the 10-pound book, take one peek inside, you’ll notice very quickly why you haven’t read it cover to cover. It’s not necessarily the best drama. It’s not a thriller. There’s not even a plot. If you’re looking for stories as dramatic as William Shakespeare or as magical as Harry Potter, you won’t find it here. If you’re looking for why Lutherans are what they are, you’ve got it all right here. It is infinitely more valuable than any other book you’ve read before (with the exception of Holy Scripture, of course). Why? Because over 500 years ago, the Lord used certain men in a certain time to preach and teach the truth of His Word during a time when it was being used and abused for earthly gain. The authority of the Word of God reigned. And within this exposition of God’s Word, you’ll find many incredible statements of faith from our Lutheran forefathers. Here is one of them: “Your faith means that you rely firmly upon God with unshakable assurance and trust, holding on to this assurance in every difficulty and tribulation.”

Those words just ooze out confidence and boldness. Isn’t that the whole idea? Can’t we be confident and bold in our God? As much as we want to exude confidence and boldness, it can be really hard to. Have you ever had an “unshakable” faith? Have you always held on to this assurance in every difficulty and tribulation? I certainly have not. And I know I’m not alone- Moses didn’t want to serve God at first. He was too worried about what to say and how to say it. The entire nation of Israel certainly had their doubts (so much so that they were stranded in the wilderness until the next generation followed!). The disciples scattered on the night in which Jesus was betrayed. The great Pilgrims of Scripture did not have unshakable assurance- and yet, regardless of how weak they might have been, God was even stronger. Every time they fell, God raised them up. Every time they went astray, God herded them back in. Every time the earth shook around them with chaos, heartache, and misery, God gave them an unshakable hope. And he will undeniably do this for you too! Peter writes in 2 Peter 2- *“<sup>3</sup> His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence, <sup>4</sup> by which he has granted to us his precious and very great promises...”*

## Operation Layette's Thursday, June 3 @ 7:00 P.M.




What is Operation Layette's? This is a Council of Lutheran Women program. We collect layette (infant) items to give to various organizations in the Detroit area which assist pregnant women and their families in need.

In the past, many layettes assembled by the members of St. Paul, Royal Oak, are delivered to various organizations such as; Image of God Pregnancy Center of Detroit, a pro-life advocacy program that helps women in crisis with spiritual and physical needs, as well as Compassion Pregnancy, Peace in Detroit, and St. Joseph's Hospital in Pontiac.

You may donate baby items throughout the year. Types of donations accepted are: Onesies and sleepers (3-6 months); receiving blankets; cloth diapers; socks and booties; sweater sets (knit or fleece); baby lotion; bottles; infant toys.

## SPOTLIGHT ON STEWARDSHIP—

The weeks after Easter are fantastic time of the year! Warmer weather starts to settle in. The days are longer, the world turns greener. It is simply wonderful to see the world around us renewing itself. The weeks after Easter are a great time in the church year too! They lead into celebrations like Pentecost and events like Confirmation. Both provide awesome opportunities for us to reflect on our faithfulness.

It is exciting to recall that before Jesus' Ascension, He promised the disciples that they will not be alone in their mission to spread the Word. This promise came to pass in Acts 2, when "suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested[a] on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." What a vivid and astonishing telling of the Holy Spirit coming to be with the disciples. Imagine how their faith was strengthened and the confidence it provided as they spread out proclaiming the Gospel. The Holy Spirit is always with us too, working in us, fortifying our faith.

Just before Pentecost this past month, St. Paul welcomed 4 new confirmands into our family. Through the study of the Word and Catechism, the confirmands better understood the beliefs we share. Confirmation is a fantastic reminder for all of us about our baptism and our own confirmation. We can look back and see how we have grown in faith through these early spiritual milestones. However, Confirmation is not the culmination of our spiritual learning. It helps kickstart the beginning of the rest of our lives in which we live our faith. We share it. We show it. Through our words, actions, generosity, and caring, people around us will come to know we are living faithful lives which in turn can spark the opportunity for the Holy Spirit work in and through them.

There is a good example of a faithful young man in our church who, over the past couple of years, has shared his faith through his service. Craig Rinkus took on an integral part of leading the confirmation classes this year. Back in the summer of 2020, Pastor Andrzejewski approached Craig about potentially sharing teaching responsibilities for confirmation. They knew each other from seminary and their relationship opened the door for this opportunity. Craig accepted. He referenced his own confirmation experience to connect to and teach the confirmands. The process made him reflect on his faith and he learned from the confirmands. From Sunday classes, to preparation of verses and faith statements, the public examination, Craig was there, collaborating with Pastor and guiding his class toward confirmation. Craig's service at St. Paul is not limited to teaching the Confirmation class. You may see him assisting with the screens in early service. Craig also leads the Young Adult Bible studies. St. Paul is blessed to have members like Craig, who are equipped in ways to support specific needs of the church.

Whether it is the celebration of Pentecost, sharing in the experience of young folks being confirmed and taking communion for the first time, or witnessing our St. Paul members like Craig, using their talents and interests to support the rest of us and the community, there is always something we can be encouraged by through church that can help us grow in our faith and bolster our faithfulness.

towards this gift, please bring your donation to the church or school office labeled "Gift for Pastor". Make your check payable to St. Paul Lutheran Church. Thank you.



## St Paul Current Protection Guidelines

As of May 18, 2021, St. Paul Lutheran Church will be adjusting the mask policy according to the latest update from the CDC and Governor Whitmer. Please see below for the most current safety protocols and expectations-

1. Safety Protocol
  - a. We will continue to encourage the sick, compromised, and those who are uncomfortable to stay home and watch our Livestream worship service.
  - b. Masks will now be optional for those who have been fully vaccinated. In order to be considered fully vaccinated, you must have:
    - i. 2 weeks after your second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
    - ii. 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine.
  - c. Green tape will still mark the pews to encourage social distancing.
  - d. The Lutheran Service Books, attendance cards, and pencils are placed back into the pews.
  - e. We will leave the offering plates in the narthex until further notice. You may still drop off your envelopes there and/or submit your offerings online. Please drop your completed attendance card in the plate in the narthex as you leave.
2. Communion
  - a. The Sacrament of the Altar will still be prepared following CDC safety protocols for food preparation.
  - b. We will maintain the "continuous line" method for distributing the Lord's Supper.
  - c. For those who have been fully vaccinated, you are not required to wear a mask as you approach the Lord's table.
  - d. Pastor Andrzejewski and the elders assisting him will be wearing a mask as they distribute the elements.
  - e. The common cup will still be suspended until further notice
