
A Kingdom Built

It's 9:24am on a cloudy, damp Monday morning. As I'm writing this article, I'm sitting in my office drinking my morning java as I do every morning here at St. Paul. I usually like to get to the office earlier than everyone else and enjoy the silence, the peace of this church that I get to share with the Lord before his saints come into work the harvest. It's nice. But I'm not alone this morning. I haven't been for a while, actually. As I peek outside of my office window, there they are again. Those busy bumblebees. With the bright orange vests (sometimes highlighter yellow depending on their mood). Construction workers building a Babel-like tower with no end of height in sight. They've been at it for months. Hours on end, day after day. We've come a long way from the tower of Babel – but our hands are just as busy. Our need to build and construct and prepare just as bad. There's never enough room in the world for everyone, is there? Not to mention the cost of an arm and a leg just to get a 1-bedroom apartment here in Royal Oak. But when it's done – it's certainly a sight to see.

Have you tried to imagine what the buildings of heaven might look like? Are there angels in orange or yellow vests working cranes and bulldozers? Is there a 3-year waiting period to get the finest apartment complex of the Kingdom – you know, the rooms that are "river-of-life" side? It's hard to imagine what heaven will look like. We've been given sneak peaks throughout Scripture, but that's all. You might prominently know St. John's description from Revelation 21 (holy city, radiance like a most rare jewel, gold, jasper, glass, emeralds, pearls, etc.) And while all that is glorious, how do we know there's enough room for you and me?

The night before Jesus was crucified, He told his disciples: "In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:2-3). The Greek word for "house" is literally translated as "an abode" or "dwelling place." Pair this promise of Jesus with his language of "taking you to myself" and you have... well, enough room for you and me. You see, Jesus is making a point here. It's not about how much room is left. It's not about the buildings, the jasper, the gold, or the gates. It's about "where I am". $\dot{\epsilon}\gamma\dot{\omega}$ $\dot{\epsilon}i\mu\dot{\iota}$, Jesus says. I am. That in each moment he exits, there you are with him. Any room" he is in, there you stand. Any mansion that he has prepared for you, there you will be with him. And the cost? Well, it wasn't an arm or a leg. It was his life for yours. His bloodshed. His humiliation. His scars.

There may never be enough room for everyone here in this world- but there's certainly more than enough there in heaven. And when Jesus "takes you to himself," this I can assure you: it will be a sight to see.




LWML Mite Collections - The first weekend of every month you will notice at the welcome center a big purple and white box with little boxes in front of it. Next time this is out, please
