THE LORD IS OUR HELP

There was a man named Pat and he had a complex story of rehabilitation. He was married, had a nice car, had a nice house, had a good job, and he had many friends. Once he became addicted to alcohol and drugs, his world flipped. He lost his job, and his wife filed for a divorce. His house and his car was taken from him and he found himself on the streets with nothing to lose except for his life. He was in and out of rehab many times, but none of them lasted very long. Pat had nothing, but it was in this moment where he had nothing that he thought to himself that he would go to his father who had been sober for 28 years to ask for help.

This is when he seriously entered rehab once again. Someone asked him to go to a meeting where they were reading the Big Book, and Pat found himself being described in this book. He had gone so many years and he had finally found some sort of footing in his spinning world. It was then that he gained even more stability with faith in the Lord. Pat found that his faith in God had helped him reclaim a part of himself that he had been missing when he was using and drinking.

When we go home in the evening, we may not have addictions which cause great struggles for us, but we all may sympathize that we do not always base our lives around our faith in God. Instead, we lift up our eyes to the hills looking for help. We could find ourselves lifting our eyes to the hill of drugs, alcohol, social media, video games, TV, or anything that causes us to search for a way to cope with our lives.

It is times of struggle that have us seeking harder and harder for something to fill this pit in our soul. This is why we go to the mindless activities of playing video games, looking at social media, or watching TV. Although these things are not bad on their own, we may find ourselves looking to those things or other similar activities for a way out of our own lives. We hope to find a kind of joy or endorphin high which is released when we perform these activities. We look to the hills of these things which have nothing to offer us except for a fleeting thrill.

When we engage in activities which we look to in times of need, we create for ourselves a handpicked god which is not a god at all, and we find ourselves wasting our lives on meaningless shows or videos which have nothing to do with our day to day lives. We are in need of something to fill that same God-sized hole in our lives.

Psalmist assures us that our help does not come from these other hills. On them, we find nothing lasting. Instead, when we ask where our help comes from, we can join together and say, "My help comes from the Lord who made heaven and earth."

O Lord God, You are our help in every time of need. Help us to look to You in all of our needs of body and soul. Grant us the desire to find our joy and solace in Your caring arms at all times and in all places. Guide us to reject whatever we find on other hills where we seek peace and find only meaninglessness. Help us to seek You, for You are our help. Amen.

SERVANT SPOTLIGHT What is Stewardship?

What is a steward? Most people, when asked this question, will reply: "A manager." That is correct, but it is only half right. A steward is indeed a manager, but he is a manager of what does not belong to him. Someone else is the owner, and the steward manages the owner's property on the owner's behalf.

We are God's stewards. Our stewardship is that God has made us managers of what belongs to Him. For we have brought nothing into this world, and we can take nothing out of it (1 Tim. 6:7). Everything that we have and everything that we are comes from God's fatherly Divine goodness and mercy. God is the owner. Not only because, as the Creator, He created all things. But also, as the Redeemer, He has redeemed, that is, purchased and won all things. It all, therefore, belongs to Him.

We are simply managers of everything in this world. Like Joseph in Egypt, we are put in charge of managing what belongs to God. What a privilege. Think about that for a minute. The all-knowing, all-powerful, all-wise God has asked us to manage His possessions on His behalf here on earth. And by doing this, He invites us to take part in the allocation of His good gifts. He wants us to give our input and advise Him in where His gifts are to be used. What a privilege indeed.

What a responsibility. For to whom much is given, much shall be required (Luke 12:48). We are not the owners. And while He puts us as managers, we are still to do with His property what He wants done with it. That means we need to know what His desire and will for His property is.

How do we know this? How can we know the will and mind of God? We find the will of God in the Bible. There God tells us what His will for all His gifts are to be used. He tells us how we are to spend our time and use our talents and treasures. He instructs us in the use of our minds, bodies, and souls.

There is nothing that we have that doesn't belong to Him. "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20). He informs us of the big picture, the overarching policy, of how we as His stewards – His managers and custodians – of His property are to do the managing.

And that is what stewardship is. It is simply doing what God wants us to do with what He has given us. As St. Paul said: "Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness" (Rom. 6:13). So, let's dive into the God's Word and listen to what the owner desires from His stewards.

The church divides the year into different seasons that emphasize the life of Christ and the life of the church. Beginning on Sunday, November 27, 2022, we will enter the season of the church year called Advent. Advent is the season of preparation and anticipation leading up to Christmas, and continuing through to Epiphany January 6, 2023, celebrated here on the 8th.
