# From Our Music Minister Mr. Greg Paul

In October of this year St. Paul will complete 150 years of proclaiming the Gospel here in Royal Oak.

As part of our celebration we have commissioned a former vicar, Jon Vieker (vicar from 1985-86) to compose a choral work for our choirs and congregation. This will be sung at our celebration worship on October 1, 2023. It is hoped that it could then be published through Concordia Publishing House (CPH) so other choirs and congregations may use it as well.

As a parish musician I find great joy in playing music that has been dedicated to various people or congregations, thinking of their ministry to the Church over the years. How neat it would be for others to share in our joy.

years. How neat it would be for others to share in our joy. Reverend Vieker currently is Associate Professor of Practical Theology and Dean of Chapel for Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. He is well equipped to handle the task of creating an anniversary composition for us. His undergraduate degree is a Bachelor of Arts in Music and his academic interest is in hymnody. He is a member of Hymn societies in the U.S., Canada, Great Britain, Ireland, and Germany. He is a published composer of choral anthems and organ preludes through Concordia Publishing House. He has also contributed to two hymns in our hymnal, Lutheran Book of Worship (LSB). Jon is very excited to take on this task.

The following is the text that will be used for the commissioned composition. It is printed below so you can ponder its richness think of it in terms of the generations that have been, are here now, and will be at St. Paul Lutheran, Royal Oak. The text was originally written by Jaroslav J. Vajda for a Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) anniversary.

Vajda (1919-2008) was a strong contributor to American and more specifically Lutheran Hymnody. We have ten of his hymns in our hymnal, LSB. The text follows:

# MINISTRY



Consider the first time you walked into St. Paul. Maybe it was a short time ago or maybe it was decades ago. Maybe you were born into the congregation. Hopefully you felt welcome and comfortable learning more about the goings on at St. Paul beyond worship or school.

For Colleen Olsen, who joined St. Paul shortly after moving to the area with her husband Mark some 35 years ago, it didn't take long for her to discover something meaningful and special. She was invited to join the Women's Guild, specifically the Rebecca's Circle, by Patti Adams and Tina Eising shortly after becoming a member. The Circle led all sorts of activities in support of Confirmation at that time. They partnered

with the confirmands in prayer for the year and they provided the reception when the eight graders affirmed their faith. Colleen quickly made new friends and valued the many opportunities to meet and participate. Colleen has been an active Women's Guild member and eventual leader ever since.

Colleen and Mark have 2 children who both were baptized, attended the day school, and were confirmed at St. Paul. As their children grew, Colleen was moved to serve on the Youth Board in addition to the Guild. Being involved in service and fellowship activities with the children her kids grew up with and their parents fostered great relationships that remain. In both areas, service to others, fellowship and faith are intertwined. Colleen recalled a time when Mariah, her daughter, witnessed a friend who was also a St. Paul alumnus being bullied in high school for wearing a shirt with Jesus on it. She defended her friend without hesitation and wore Christ-centered shirts after that to gym class. Mariah was equipped to handle that situation because of the foundation provided by her parents through St. Paul day school and all the Christ centered activity fostered by the Youth group.

Service is simply part of the Olsen family DNA now. Mark is an active trustee and their son, Erik, often ushers and volunteers at many of the community service opportunities St. Paul is a part of.

Just consider how it all started though, these many years of activity within the congregation for Colleen and her family. It started with a small invitation. We all can be intentional and active in reaching out to people who come into the doors at St. Paul. A smile, a 'Hello', an introduction, a wave...little things like this can start a relationship that encourages faith and fellowship and grows into friendship and active service.

#### Making Progress Behind the Scenes

Congregation and friends, you can rest assured the Our House His Throne project team has been hard at work making good progress behind the scenes.

Although you have not seen walls coming down or heard hammering and sawing, there is a lot of progress being made on the Our House His Throne capital campaign. As we have explained throughout the campaign, this is a major initiative with many steps. Like any significant construction project, much of the initial work is not visible.

In December, after identifying and interviewing several qualified partner firms, we contracted with two firms for the initial steps. One is a construction management firm with extensive experience with projects like ours. The other is a specialized roofing firm that will survey our roofs to determine the exact needs.

In January, our Project Team from St. Paul of Darren Sipila, Ken Ruszkowski, Mike Rasmussen, and Richard Baker, met with the construction management firm to discuss details of all the potential projects as well as review existing church and school drawings and our renovation conceptual drawings. This firm is now developing conceptual plans and estimates including identifying where forensic root cause testing is needed to determine and confirm the best construction solutions.


Our construction efforts will be conducted during the summer of 2024. The work will be executed to maximize efficiencies of project management and construction labor costs through a single managed project by grouping together an approved and funded bundle of sub-projects.

Other good news is that the contributions to Our House His Throne continue to be strong as members and friends of St. Paul are meeting their pledges. Thank you!

Please continue to pray for Our House His Throne and the people involved in planning and executing these very important projects. The completion of these construction projects will help St. Paul be even more effective in our ministry to the Royal Oak area and beyond just as we have been for the past 150 years.
