"Oh Sing to the Lord a New Song"

– Psalm 96:1a

Sometimes I feel there's nothing new in music, it's all old. I joke with the Chancel Choir about little snippets of melody found in music we're working on that seem to come from other songs. It becomes a game for us to figure out where we've heard that melodic phrase before. Somehow though, composers still find ways of putting those phrases together in new and refreshing combinations. Some of those creations can move us in a powerful way. During my ministry

I've enjoyed learning and leading "new songs" whether from our *Lutheran Service Book.* or more contemporary songs. Two of my new favorites of this past year were LSB 699 " I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say" and LSB 473 "Our Paschal Lamb, that Sets Us Free." From the contemporary genre, I particularly have enjoyed "Blessed Be Your Name," and "Build Your Kingdom Here."

I'd like you to take a look at the concept of a "new song" not so much as a text set to music to be sung in worship, but rather a dynamic, ever fresh response to God in response to his grace and favor for us. A search of scripture for the words "new song" lists nine occurrences of that pair of words together. Six are found in the Psalms (Chapters 33, 40, 96, 98, 144, and 149), one in Isaiah (42:10) and two in Revelation (5:9 and 14:3). All the commands to "sing a new song" are in response to great things God has done. In one case (Psalm 40:3) God puts the "new song" of praise into the Psalmist's mouth . What makes the song new? It seems to me that the "new song" is a personal response to God's love and mercy. It is ever new because it is never the same, a spontaneous expression of prayer and praise to our God set to song. Five of the nine occurrences were commands to "sing a new song".

The last occurrence of "new song" is a unique one and really intrigues me. God set the physics of music into the fabric of creation, but music, like everything else of creation is cursed because of the fall into sin. What must untainted music or song sound like? It's beyond our comprehension. Revelation 14:3 speaks of a "new song" that only those around the throne can learn. It points us to a time when we in heaven join in that song that is so wonderful and powerful that we cannot on this side bear to experience it. WOW! The phrase from our liturgy comes to mind: "Therefore, with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify Your glorious name, evermore praising You and saying..." In anticipation and preparation for that great day, sing your new song today and every day! Perhaps that's what Paul is writing about when he states, "making melody with your heart to the Lord," Ephesians 5:19-20. As you dwell on God's grace for you, let that move you to a prayerful "new song" in your heart

to God.



Stewardship Spotlight

When church members hear "stewardship," their minds tend to leap to tithing. In honor of Mother's and Father's Days, however, we can consider the stewardship of parents and children:

The Fourth Commandment, "Honor your father and your mother," is most often seen as a command for obedience, but it's also a directive to care for and help (according the Small Catechism - honor, serve, obey, love, and esteem) your parents as they age, to the best of your abilities. This may involve checking in on them, taking them to appointments, helping with projects around the house, or hiring capable assistance.

On the other side, parents are instructed to provide for their children, not just by supporting physical needs, but spiritual needs, as well. Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." Instruct them in the home through Bible reading and devotions, send them to Sunday School, and - where available - send them to a Lutheran School. The more consistently our children hear God's word, the more likely they are to stay in it when they go off on their own and, in-turn, raise their own children in The Word.

Extending Grace

Ephesians 4:29 Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the

occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. For the past ten days, I have been contemplating God's grace to us and how we, in turn, can extend grace to others.

We naturally do just the opposite. We see and tell people how they should change and improve rather than encourage them in what they are doing right. We are impatient with a clerk who is slow in serving us, and we point out faults in our spouse and children. We slander our co-workers and pastors. How can we become gracious — more like Jesus is with us?

In his book *Putting a Face on Grace*, Richard Blackaby has some tips for us:

- Speak words intended to build up, not to bring down.
- Focus on the needs of others, rather than your own.
- Freely forgive.
- Swallow your pride and say, "I'm sorry," and "I was wrong."
- Live your life with a goal of "no regrets."
- Don't keep score of what is fair.
- Don't condemn or give up on people.
- Emphasize mercy, not justice.
- Read 1 Corinthians 13 regularly.

And always keep in mind that it is God's Spirit within us who will change us into becoming people who extend grace to others.

Father, you continually show grace to your children no matter how many times we mess up. Thank you so much. We don't deserve your love. Enable us, through the power of your Holy Spirit, to become people of grace. Amen.


