#### From Vicar Adam Hiles

"If Advent is all about awaiting the arrival of something, then Epiphany is all about revelation of what has come. All of Advent, we awaited Jesus' coming. This beautiful Christmas season, we celebrate His coming in His birth by the virgin Mary. Soon, during this upcoming season of Epiphany, we focus on His revelation; we see who this Jesus is, and what exactly that means.

The greatest example of this revelation is when Mary and Joseph presented the baby Jesus to Simeon in the temple. You'd expect that, seeing a baby that looks like all the other babies, Simeon wouldn't think much of Jesus. But Simeon did not have vague ideas about who the Christ would be, or nebulous views about who his Lord was. By the revelation of the Holy Spirit, when Simeon sees the infant Christ, he sees God's salvation, the light for the revelation of the Gentiles and the glory for Israel. And in this, Simeon rejoiced.

In the same way, we do not await the coming of our Lord with vague ideas about who He is. Rather, we await Him as He has been revealed to us by the Holy Spirit: The Crucified One, who by His death and resurrection won for us salvation, and will return to judge the World. In this, we too rejoice.

Since we know full well who our Lord is, let us continually press on to know Him by devoting ourselves to His Word. Let us await Him by singing the very song of Simeon as we see God's salvation in the Supper, and receive His very body and blood as we are bid by Christ's own invitation. And awaiting Him, may we gladly submit to God's law, and rejoice in doing the works which He has prepared for us.



#### SPOTLIGHT on STEWARDSHIP

Giving isn't always easy. If you're struggling financially, it can be even harder. Monthly bills, credit card payments, and inflation seem to take everything there is – and nothing is left over for giving. Perhaps you want to give, but

just don't see a way to make it happen.

Good news! God sees your situation. He knows your needs and has your ultimate good on his mind. He knows how to take care of you and how to grow you as a disciple, even in the midst of financial difficulty.

And giving is part of this – not the only part, but an important part.

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Matthew 6:21

In the midst of the Sermon on the Mount as he's teaching about money, Jesus makes this surprise statement: our hearts follow our treasure. We would think it would work the other way – we'd put our treasure where our hearts already are. But this isn't the way Jesus says it works. Giving is important because it helps to determine the direction of our hearts.

#### It Can Be Done

The Bible gives us several examples of individuals and even churches giving out of difficult financial circumstances. These stories inspire us as we see how God provided for those who gave and how he used their gifts to bless others.

#### THE WIDOW OF ZAREPHATH

Because of King Ahab's wickedness, God had pronounced a drought on the land. Elijah delivered this news to King Ahab, and then went into hiding. God further directed him to a town called Zarephath. In this town was a poor widow, who was likely further impacted by the drought. God directed her to feed Elijah.

When Elijah arrived, he asked this widow for a drink and for a piece of bread. She responded that she didn't have any bread; she was about to use her last flour and oil to make a final meal for herself and her son, who were on the verge of starvation. Elijah promised her that God would supply flour and oil for her and her son through the entire

drought if she would feed him first. She took God at his word and fed Elijah first, and God took care of her and her son.

Not only did this build the faith of the widow, but it served as such an important example of faith that Jesus later referred to it (Luke 4:24-26). God had a larger plan than caring for this one family – he was setting this up as an example of his love for all peoples and all nations. The widow probably had no idea the role she was playing in God's redemptive story!

#### THE WIDOW AT THE TEMPLE

Jesus was standing where he could see the treasury chest and watching people place their offerings into the chest. People put in varying amounts, some of them quite large. But Jesus' attention was drawn to a poor widow, who put in just two small copper coins.

He called the disciples to him and pointed her out, telling them that her gift was actually greater than the larger gifts of the rich people, because she gave sacrificially – everything she had. (Mark 12:41-44; Luke 21:1-4)

#### THE MACEDONIAN CHURCHES

The church in Jerusalem was suffering as a result of famine and poverty. Paul spent considerable time coordinating a collection for the Jerusalem church among churches he had established. And the Macedonian churches had responded – even though they themselves suffered from significant poverty. According to Paul, these churches actually approached him and pleaded for the opportunity to take part in the offering! (2 Corinthians 8:1-5)

The common result in all of these stories is that God was honored through the giving of his people. None of these people or churches gave much in terms of actual amounts — a piece of bread and a drink; two small copper coins; an offering taken from poor churches. But God used each of these gifts to bless others and to expand the faith of his followers.

## Three Biblical New Year's Resolutions

It is time again to make New Year's resolutions. Our lives will be blessed in the coming year as we keep these three biblical resolutions.

Lose weight. After eating all those holiday season meals, many people resolve to start the New Year off by losing a few pounds. While losing weight may improve one's health, the Bible speaks of losing "weight" that will improve one's spiritual well-being. Consider Hebrews 12:1: "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us." In this passage, the Christian life is depicted as a race. One who is running in a footrace would not want any extra weight that might hinder his

performance. Likewise, the Christian who is running the Christian race must lay aside anything that might hinder his progress for the Lord. Even good wholesome things can become "weights" that hinder one from living the Christian life. A job, recreational activities, pursuing an education, the love of money, or some sin may become a "weight" in our lives.

**Exercise.** "But refuse profane and old wives' fables, and exercise thyself rather unto godliness. For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come" (1 Timothy 4:7-8). A regular exercise routine profits the body a "little," but a spiritual workout in godly living will profit your soul, your family, your friends, and your work associates.

Save Money. Having blown the budget during the Christmas season, many of us will resolve to spend less and save more as we begin the New Year. This will surely put dollars in the bank, but the Lord spoke about how we can deposit money in heaven: "But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is there will your heart be also" (Matthew 6:20-21). To the rich young ruler Jesus said, "If thou wilt be perfect, go and sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come and follow me" (Matthew 19:21). By giving to the Lord's cause and to those who are in need, we actually "save" ("lay up") treasures in heaven. It would be impossible for us to out- give the Lord. He has richly blessed our lives, and we should give back to Him.
