A New Lenten Hymn to Consider

Last fall our Jr. Chancel Choir from the school participated in a Choral Clinic held at St. John in Fraser and led by Dr. Busarow of Fort Wayne, IN. He is the artistic director and head of the Fort Wayne Children's Choir and has deep Lutheran roots. One of the songs we worked on (~125 Lutheran grade school choir kids) was a new hymn for our hymnal, LSB 428, "Cross of Jesus, Cross of Sorrow."

The text for the hymn is listed below:

Cross of Jesus, cross of sorrow Where the blood of Christ was shed, Perfect man on thee did suffer, Perfect God on thee has bled!	O mysterious condescending! O abandonment sublime! Very God Himself is bearing. All the sufferings of time!
Here the King of all the ages, Throned in light ere worlds could be, Robed in mortal flesh is dying, Crucified by sin for me.	Cross of Jesus, cross of sorrow, Where the blood of Christ was shed, Perfect man on thee did suffer, Perfect God on thee has bled!

Stanza three has particularly intriguing words, language you would only here in a church. "O mysterious condescending! O abandonment sublime!" Take some time to read through and think about this text.

William J. Sparrow Simpson, a Church of England Priest, is the author of this hymn. He lived from 1859 till 1952. His connection to church music was through texts he wrote for musician John Stainer. Stainer had written a passion oratorio similar in structure to Bach's Passions. The title was *The Crucifixion*, published in 1887. It is still performed to this day. Our hymn "Cross of Jesus, Cross of Sorrow" (LSB 428) was a part of that oratorio. We will at some point learn this hymn that has long been a part of other Christian denomination's hymnals.

Here are the other stanzas from *The Crucifixion* that are not included in our hymnal.

Evermore for human failure By His Passion we can plead; God has borne all mortal anguish, Surely He will know our need.	Up in Heaven, sublimest glory Circled round Him from the first; But the earth fins none to serve Him, None to quench His raging thirst
This—all human thought surpassing This is earth's most awful hour, God has taken mortal weakness! God has laid aside His Power!	Who shall fathom that descending From the rainbow-circled throne, Down to earth's most base profaning Dying desolate alone.
Once the Lord of brilliant seraphs, Winged with Love to do His Will, Now the scorn of all His creatures, And the aim of every ill.	From the "Holy, Holy, Holy, We adore Thee, O most High," Down to earth's blaspheming voices And the shout of "Crucify."

SPOTLIGHT on STEWARDSHIP

Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have ever bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you'll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, "That's mine: I had it first."

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are his: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20). If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since you belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship and is the key stewardship insight that runs through all of the Christian life: It all belongs to God. Everything that we have has been given to us by God. We deserve none of it. All of it comes to us by God's fatherly kindness and open-handed generosity.
