## EASTER REALITY

Dear Friends,

**Christ is risen!** These words do not simply point to a historical event; they herald the birth of a new reality; for you, for me, for all Christians; a reality where we have been raised with Christ, and share in His Easter life! This reality is something that Satan cannot abide with, and he is always working to try and snatch it from us - he tries to snatch away our joy, our hope, and our love. So easy is it for us to lose sight of what God has done for us and think we are still weak, feeble, and incapable of making a difference. Below is a beautiful quote from Saint Cyprian of Carthage (martyred for his faith in 258 AD), where he writes so beautifully of what this Easter reality means for us:

"...For as I myself was held in bonds by the innumerable errors of my previous life, from which I did not believe that I could by possibility be delivered, so I was disposed to acquiesce in my clinging vices; and because I despaired of better things, I used to indulge my sins as if they were actually parts of me, and indigentous to me. But after that, **by the help of the water of new birth, the stain of former years had been washed away, and a light from above, serene and pure, had been infused into my reconciled heart — after that, by the agency of the Spirit breathed from heaven, a second birth had restored me to a new man — then, in a wondrous manner, doubtful things at once began to assure themselves to me, hidden things to be revealed, dark things to be enlightened, what before had seemed difficult began to suggest a means of accomplishment, what had been thought impossible, to be capable of being achieved;** so that I was enabled to acknowledge that what previously, being born of the flesh, had been living in the practice of sins, was of the earth earthly, but had now begun to be of God, and was animated by the Spirit of holiness. You yourself assuredly know and recollect as well as I do what was taken away from us, and what was given to us by **that death of evil, and that life of virtue.** You yourself know this without my information. Anything like boasting in one's own praise is hateful, although we cannot in reality boast but **only be grateful for whatever we do not ascribe to man's virtue but declare to be the gift of God;** so that now we sin not is the beginning of the work of faith, whereas that we sinned before was the result of human error. **All our power is of God; I say, of God.** From Him we have **life**, from Him we have **strength**, by power derived and conceived from Him we do, while yet in this world, foreknow the indications of things to come. Only let fear be the keeper of innocence, that the **Lord, who of His mercy has flowed into our hearts in the access of celestial grace, may be kept by righteous submissiveness in the home of a grateful mind, that the assurance we have gained may not beget carelessness, and so the old enemy creep upon us again.**"

Dear Christian, you **CAN** make a difference. You **CAN** be faithful. You **CAN** show Jesus' love to everyone in your life. This Easter reality is one of endless possibilities, opportunities, and joy. And in Christ, it is **yours**.





Find the words on the list that are hidden in the puzzle. The words can be left to right, up and down, or diagonally.



## SPOTLIGHT on STEWARDSHIP

"But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: 'Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine'" (Is. 43:1).

Let's start with a question: Of what will you be more likely to take greater care? Something you own? Or something that isn't yours?

As God plainly states through Isaiah, stewards that have been created and are being sustained by God have no reason to fear. Why? Because they belong to God! They are owned fully by Him. With His mighty power the Lord created them. By His amazing grace, He has redeemed them in the innocent suffering and death of His beloved Son Jesus! You, my friend in Christ, are doubly owned!

God, as the Owner of all things by virtue of creation, sees you as a treasured possession. He promises never to hold out on you. He may not make you stupendously wealthy, incredibly intelligent, or dashingly beautiful. But you do have the sure and certain promise that God IS with you. In Word and Sacrament, our Lord dwells with you, giving you His gifts of life and salvation!

As one contemplates the simple gifts our Lord gives and how we might be called to share them with the Church for the Gospel and our neighbors for God's glory, we need not fear. We have His promise that He will be with us. For this reason, we can indeed be extravagantly generous! We have the Lord's promise! He will not abandon us. The faithful stewardship and generosity to which we are called is to be a confession of our trust in His promise. It isn't always easy. But this is the stewardship to which we have been called. But it isn't about us. It is all about the One who owns us! In Him we believe. In Him we trust. In Him we have no reason to fear. Because of Him we are free to be faithful stewards of all He has. It is for His glory and our neighbor's benefit!

- Send a "Thankful for you" postcard out to friends/family/church members once a month

*"What if before we ever begin our Thanksgiving season, we were to start living thanks before God in a continual state? What if we prayerfully recognized where all things come from every day of the year? Even more, what if our thanksgiving was rooted not in our circumstances, but in God Himself? Giving thanks to God for all His blessings and provisions at Thanksgiving time is a wonderful tradition but continuing this year around becomes more than tradition. It becomes a way of life, made possible by the love of God shown to us in Christ."*
