A Favorite Hymn for November LSB 677 For All the Saints

This hymn written for All Saints day is a hymn found in hymnals of many denominations. The author of the hymn was William How (1823 – 1897). He was a humble Anglican Bishop who, in spite of a privileged upbringing, served a simple rural parish and spent his later years serving the poor in poverty-stricken London.

This hymn was specifically written for All Saints Day and had the original title of "Saints Day Hymn - Cloud of Witnesses – Hebrews 12:1" The second line of the first verse sums up the Gospel message of how heaven is obtained: "Who, Thee by faith before the world confessed." Faith, not works is how saints rest from their labors. It's Jesus' name that is forever blest, we have faith in his work for us. The hymn was first published in a collection in 1864 entitled *Hymns for Saints Days and Other Hymns*. Although he wrote many poems in his day, "For All the Saints" is the most famous. It's one that in spite of his humility he even referred to by name. So esteemed were his poems that he was asked to compose a national hymn for Britain for Queen Victoria's Jubilee in 1897. He unfortunately died later that year before completing the task.

The tune to which it is sung was written by notable English composer Ralph Vaughn Williams. Williams had a strong interest in English folk tunes and he compiled a set of over 800 tunes, traveling all over Great Britain. He was editor of the 1906 *English Hymnal* where he included many of these tunes. His work revived many English and Welsh tunes for religious use. In addition to three tunes of Vaugh Williams in our hymnal (For All the Saints, Hail Thee Festival Day, and Come Down, O Love Divine) we continue to use many of his settings of English and Welsh tunes in our hymnal. ("Go My Children With My Blessing", "From all the Dwell Below the Skies", "Your Hand, O Lord in Days of Old," and others)

We will be collecting donations online this year through St. Paul's Goal Page from now until November 25. For \$25 you can share the Gospel of


Jesus with a child somewhere around the world this Christmas season. Our goal is to build 60 shoeboxes!
