Hebrews 9:24–28

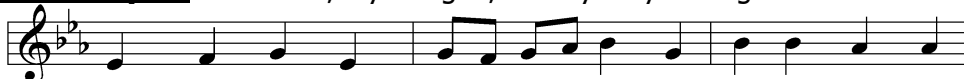

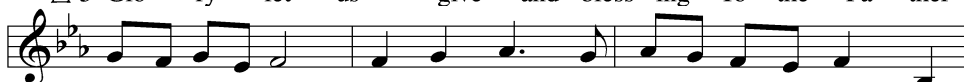
