



Easter Proclamation

- **O** death, where is your sting? Alleluia! Alleluia!


Kneel/Sit for Confession of Sins

Confession and Absolution

- Time and again, Scripture has called us to "remember." Remember, the apostle Paul says in Acts 5, "Jesus, whom you killed by hanging on a tree." Remember, Peter says in Acts 3 "Jesus whom you delivered over... and asked for a murderer to be granted to you; that you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead." Remember, people of Christ, what had happened...
- C Lord, we remember. We remember that we dishonored the one who honored us. We held in contempt the one who held us in esteem. We denied the one who publicly acknowledged us. We renounced the one who proclaimed us as his own. We killed the one who made us to live. Even now in thought, word, and deed, we remember our sins against you. Revive us in your mercy and destroy our sins as you destroyed death.
- Remember: "I am the living one. I died, and behold, I am alive forevermore" (*Revelation 1:18*). Remember: "I have blotted out your transgressions like a cloud and your sins like mist; return to me, for I have redeemed you" (*Isaiah 44:22*).

Remember that these things are written so that you may believe and have life in his name (*John 20:31*). Remember, and believe. In the victory Christ has won for us, be revived in mercy: As a called and ordained servant of the Risen Lord, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Easter Gospel


Luke 24:1–12

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-fourth chapter.

G Glory to You, O Lord.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise." And they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles, but these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter rose and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; and he went home marveling at what had happened.



Nicene Creed

Prayer of Thanksgiving




