## "FAQS AND FACTS"

Welcome back of FAQs and Facts! If you missed our previous episode, we discussed Lent, fasting, and Ash Wednesday. Stay tuned to find out what questions we'll ask next!

FAQ 1: Where did the Easter bunny/eggs come from?

The legend of the Easter bunny bringing eggs appears to have been brought to the United States by settlers from Germany. The German tradition of the Easter bunny (or *Oschter Haws*) migrated to America in the 1700s, accompanying German immigrants, many of whom settled in Pennsylvania. Over the past 200 years, the Easter bunny has become the most commercially recognized symbol of Easter in the United States. Other countries use other animals as the symbol of Easter, such as the cuckoo (in Switzerland).

FAQ 2: Did Jesus go to hell between his death and resurrection?

The concept that Jesus went to hell after His death on the cross comes primarily from the Apostles' Creed, which states, "He descended into hell." From earliest times, Christians have believed that Jesus' descent into hell is most clearly taught in 1 Peter 3:18—19. Lutherans have understood the Bible to teach that Christ went to hell to declare His triumph as God's Messiah over death and the power of the devil. The Lutheran confessional writing, the Formula of Concord, states in summary: "We simply believe that the entire person [Jesus Christ], God and man, descended into hell after the burial, conquered the devil, destroyed hell's power, and took from the devil all his might" (Solid Declaration, Art. IX). Although Christ's descent into hell lies beyond our understanding, we can derive great comfort from this important teaching of Scripture, especially in times when our faith is being tested.

FAQ 3: What Holy Saturday?

Holy Saturday is the name given to the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Some Christians recognize Holy Saturday, the seventh day of Holy Week, as the day on which Jesus "rested" from His work of providing salvation. As Jesus died, He called out, "It is finished!" There was no further price to pay; sin had been atoned for.

Whatever you do, ask the questions. Imagine the scenes. Enjoy the narratives. May Him who can do "immeasurable things" (Eph. 3:20) work His mighty power in you.

## **Accreditation Update**



St. Paul completed the final stages of the National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA) process In March 2025, an important step ensuring the school staff and by extension the congregation is providing an excellent academic education and is continuously improving. Ac-

creditation helps schools develop a structured improvement plan, guiding our mission and operations for longterm success. Over the past several months, our team of school staff, Pastor Andrzejewski, and a few congregation volunteers have conducted a self-study, carefully evaluating our strengths and opportunities for growth. In mid-March, we welcomed an on-site Validation Team of four Lutheran school teachers and a pastor who reviewed our findings, visited classrooms, and met with staff and stakeholders. St. Paul's accreditation team recognized five specific strengths.
