Ein Feste Burg

This month we celebrate the Reformation and the hymn long associated with the Reformation is "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," LSB 656. This hymn and its tune were written and composed by Martin Luther. Luther wrote the text as a rough paraphrase of Psalm 46, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble . . ." It's a rough paraphrase because Luther has such a strong desire to proclaim the Gospel, he adds in bits of the New Testament throughout hymn. In general the hymn depicts the battle between the devil and Christ with of course, Christ the victor.

There are two settings of this hymn in LSB. Hymn 656 uses Luther's original rhythmic tune (that's the one we sing here at St. Paul) and 657 uses a straight quarter note beat (non rhythmic "Isometric" tune) which was used by J.S. Bach in his choral settings. That tune is more popular in the rest of Christendom.

Apparently in the century following its introduction, when the hymn was sung unaccompanied in the acoustically live cathedrals, the singing would naturally slow down, eventually getting so slow that the rhythmic vitality was lost.

A movement in nineteenth century Germany, strongly supported by C.F. W. Walther (first president of the LC-MS) brought back the rhythmic version where it grew in popularity among the LC-MS Lutheran Churches. The rhythmic version didn't gain much

traction among other Christian denominations until the 1970s.

The hymn is traditionally used on Reformation, but is the Hymn of the Day for the First Sunday in Lent. That usage goes all the way back to early Lutheranism (1545), one year before Luther's death, where it was placed to review Jesus' triumph over Satan at His temptation in the wilderness. Sing this hymn with vigor.

A mighty fortress is our God, A trusty shield and weapon; He helps us free from ev'ry need That hath us now o'ertaken. The old evil foe Now means deadly woe; Deep guile and great might Are his dread arms in fight; On earth is not his equal.

With might of ours can naught be done, Soon were our loss effected; But for us fights the Valiant One, Whom God Himself elected. Ask ye, Who is this? Jesus Christ it is. Of Sabaoth Lord, And there's none other God; He holds the field forever.

Though devils all the world should fill, All eager to devour us. We tremble not, we fear no ill, They shall not overpow'r us. This world's prince may still Scowl fierce as he will, He can harm us none, He's judged; the deed is done; One little word can fell him.

The Word they still shall let remain Nor any thanks have for it; He's by our side upon the plain With His good gifts and Spirit. And take they our life, Goods, fame, child, and wife,

Let these all be gone, Our vict'ry has been won; The Kingdom ours remaineth.
