C **"Lord, show us the Father, and it is enough for us."**

P Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority, but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else believe on account of the works themselves.

Confession of the Church

Book of Concord: AC XXI & Ap XXI

P Our churches teach that the remembrance of saints may be commended to us so that we may imitate their faith and good works according to our calling.

C **But the Scriptures do not teach the invocation of saints or to ask help of saints, since they set before us Christ alone as the Mediator, Atoning Sacrifice, High Priest, and Intercessor.**

P Our confession approves giving honor to the saints. This honor is threefold.

- C** The first is thanksgiving: We give thanks to God for showing examples of His mercy; for because He forgives us, He also gives teachers and other gifts to the Church.
- P** The second honor is the strengthening of our faith: When we see Peter forgiven after his denial, we also are encouraged to believe that grace truly superabounds over sin.
- C** The third honor is the imitation, first of their faith, then of their other virtues, which everyone should imitate according to his calling.
- P** For the saints, while they lived, wanted us to look to Christ and not to themselves.
- C** They taught us to set our hearts upon the mercy of God through Christ.
- P** Therefore the whole Church should keep this rule, that the saints are to be honored by giving thanks to God, by strengthening our faith, and by imitating their faith and good works.
- C** To Christ alone we give divine honor and worship, for He alone is worthy to be invoked and heard.




Commemoration of the Faithful Departed
