



Confession and Absolution

- P Beloved in Christ, we gather before God to confess our sins, for as the Scriptures say and our Confession agrees: "All men are born in sin, that is, without fear of God, without trust in God, and with concupiscence" (Augsburg Confession II). Therefore, we are commanded to confess our sinfulness before God and one another. But what does it mean to confess?
- "To confess means not only to acknowledge sin, but also to receive the absolution and believe that by it sins are forgiven." (Apology of the Augsburg Confession, XII.39)
- **P** Do not come before God with excuses, but sincerely with contrite hearts. For a broken and contrite heart God will not despise. (*Psalm 51:17*)
- We are called to "To fear, love, and trust in God above all things," (Small Catechism, Commandment I). Yet we have placed more fear in how the world will react to our faith than in how the Lord responds to our faith.
- P We have sought security in the things that fade away in time,
- rather than in the word of God which stands forever. (*Isaiah 40:8*). We acknowledge our sin before You, O Lord. We grieve that our hearts are inclined to evil. We cannot by our own reason or strength come to You or believe in You. Have mercy upon us, O God. Forgive, renew, and lead us, that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name.
- Our God does not leave repentant hearts in their guilt. He does not measure your worth by your failures, but by the righteousness of Christ that covers you completely. Believe the Gospel. Receive the mercy. Rejoice in freedom. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the
 → Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.

Epistle 2 Timothy 3:14—4:5

As for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work.

I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. As for you, always be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.


Holy Gospel

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the eighteenth chapter.



[Jesus] told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming."' And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"




And I believe in the Holy Spirit,
