"Thanksgiving with a Side of Chaos"

(A Thanksgiving Devotion)

Every year, it happens. The turkey timer breaks, the mashed potatoes look like wallpaper paste, and Uncle Bob is once again explaining how he "almost made it" to the NFL if it weren't for that "mysterious knee injury." The dog sneaks a roll off the table, the kids are arguing over who gets the wishbone, and someone—no one knows who—brought a salad made entirely of Jell-O and fruit cocktail.

And yet, in the middle of the clatter and chaos, someone finally says it: "Let's pray." The room quiets. Forks stop clinking. Heads bow. For a moment, it's peaceful—holy, even. Because in that brief silence, we remember what this whole day is supposed to be about: gratitude to the Giver.

It's funny how often we forget that. We spend weeks planning, cooking, decorating, and stressing over the perfect Thanksgiving, only to miss the point. Our hearts, like our plates, get overfilled with the wrong things. But Scripture reminds us to pause. Psalm 100:4 says, "Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name!"

Notice that God doesn't say, "Enter with perfection." He doesn't say, "Enter with everything under control." He says, "Enter with thanksgiving." In other words, come as you are—burnt rolls, messy kitchen, family drama and all—and give thanks anyway.

The Apostle Paul puts it this way: "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:18). That's a hard verse to live out, isn't it? We're good at giving thanks when the gravy's smooth and the blessings are obvious. But "all circumstances" includes the hard stuff—the loss, the loneliness, the chairs that used to be filled with the loved ones who give thanks on the celestial level now.

And yet, it's precisely in those moments that God's grace shines brightest. Because Thanksgiving isn't really about the turkey or the table or even the people around it—it's about the cross. It's about a Savior who gave everything for you, so that your heart could overflow even when your hands are empty.

So if your Thanksgiving feels messy this year, rejoice. You're in good company. The disciples spilled more than gravy at the Last Supper, and Jesus still gave thanks. And when the day is done—when the dishes are piled high and someone's fallen asleep watching football—pause for one more quiet moment. Look around and say in your heart, "Thank You, Lord. You've given more than enough."

"Oh give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever." — Psalm 107:1

2026 Offering Envelopes are HERE!



Plate offering for 2026 will have a new format. It was decided to return to annual offering envelope boxes for our members—as opposed to mailing our envelopes out to home addresses quarterly. 
HEY PASTOR...

(A short Q&A column answering common faith or Bible questions)

Q: "What are the origins of All Saints Days occurring November 1?"

A: The roots of All Saints' Day go back to the early centuries of the Christian Church. In the days of persecution, believers would gather at the graves of martyrs to remember their faithfulness and to give thanks to God for their witness. Over time, as the number of martyrs grew, the Church set aside a common day to honor all the saints — those known and unknown — who have "fought the good fight" and now rest from their labors (2 Timothy 4:7; Revelation 14:13).

By the 9th century, November 1 became the official date for All Saints' Day in the Western Church. The night before, October 31, became known as All Hallows' Eve (what we now call Halloween), the "eve of All Saints." When we confess in the Creed, "I believe in the communion of saints," we're proclaiming that we belong to something far bigger than ourselves: the Church of all times and places, made holy by the blood of Jesus. On All Saints' Sunday, we remember that death does not have the final word — Christ does.
